General entry requirements: for studies at first cycle

Degree of Bachelor of Fine Arts or equivalent

Passed an entrance examination demonstrating artistic ability in acting

Selection

Selection for the education is made from among eligible applicants and is based on artistic merit as demonstrated in an entrance examination. The assessment is made by an admissions panel. Selection criteria are announced at the time of application.

Language of instruction

Swedish as the main language, in addition to which other Scandinavian languages and English may be used.

Guaranteed admission

A place guarantee applies to compulsory courses within programmes. Students are guaranteed a place on one of the elective courses available. Students may not take the same course more than once.

Programme structure

The two year master's programme in Acting aims to enable students to create, formulate and disseminate knowledge about acting. Students will strengthen their ability to work with artistic problems at a second cycle in an experimental and critically reflective manner in theory and practice, thereby strengthening their knowledge of acting in general and preparing themselves to conduct artistic research.

During the first three semesters, students are introduced to different perspectives on knowledge, theory, reflection and artistic research methods. These courses include knowledge production, methodology, documentation and exposition of artistic research.

Elective university-specific courses give students the opportunity to broaden their expression, relate their artistic practices to other art forms and collaborate transdisciplinarily across SKH. Degree project I-III gives students the opportunity to work on their own questions and culminates in the fourth semester.

Four thematic courses (semesters 1-4) provide in-depth knowledge of acting as a field of knowledge, theory and practice.

All courses in the programme are in the main field of study, stage and media, with the exception of the elective course. To obtain a degree, all courses must be passed.

Degree project (independent project)

For a degree of Master of Fine Arts, the student must, within the framework of the course requirements, have completed an independent project (degree project) of at least 30 credits in the main field of study.

Learning Objectives

Knowledge and understanding

For a degree of Master of Fine Arts, the student must:

- demonstrate knowledge and understanding in the main field of study, including both broad knowledge of the field and a considerable degree of specialised knowledge in areas of the field as well as specialised insight into current research and development work, and
- demonstrate familiarity with methods and processes for dealing with complex phenomena, issues and situations in the field.

Competence and skills

For a degree of Master of Fine Arts, the student shall:

- demonstrate the ability to formulate new issues autonomously and creatively and contribute to the formation of knowledge, solve more advanced problems, develop new forms of personal expression as well as to reflect critically on his or her artistic approach and that of others in the main field of study
- demonstrate the ability to create and execute his or her own ideas with his or her own personal expression, to identify, formulate and solve artistic and creative problems autonomously and also to plan and undertake advanced artistic tasks using appropriate methods within predetermined time frames
- demonstrate the ability both nationally and internationally to clearly present and discuss his or her works and artistic issues in speech, writing or in other ways and in dialogue with different audiences, and
- demonstrate the competence and knowledge required to work autonomously in a professional capacity.

Judgement and approach

For a degree of Master of Fine Arts, the student shall:

- demonstrate the ability to make assessments in the main field of study informed by relevant artistic, social and ethical issues
- demonstrate insight into the role of art in society, and
- demonstrate the ability to identify the need for further knowledge and take responsibility for his or her ongoing learning.

Transitional regulations

When the program has been terminated and the education plan suspended, students have the right to complete their education within the nominal study time and decided termination period in accordance with the *Guidelines for termination of education programmes at first and second cycle*.
