Language of Instruction

The main language of instruction is English.

Course Content

The course introduces the student to an additional range of performance practices and methods. The student deepens and further develops their performative skills in an extensive encounter with a specific choreographic work. The student practices methods of reading, writing and discussing select artistic, socially relevant and/or theoretical texts related to performing, performativity and performative practice.

Teaching Forms

Teacher-led instruction, workshops and lectures.

Intended Learning Outcomes

After completing the course the student is able to:

- 1) demonstrate an ability to differentiate and interpret the performance practices and methods presented in the course
- 2) account for the development of their performative skills in relation to the specific demands and aesthetics of a singular choreographic work and
- 3) account for methods of writing and discussing presented in the course.
