Language of Instruction

The main language of instruction is English.

Course Content

The course further develops the student's individual interests in relation to movement. Continuous encounters with various dance and movement practices, principles and styles develop the student's competence within them, with added emphasis on the interface between their own practice/interests/development and the course content. The student deepens understanding of methods for reading, writing, and discussing artistic, socially relevant, and/or theoretical texts related to concepts activated in dance practice.

Teaching Forms

Teacher-led instruction och workshops.

Intended Learning Outcomes

After completing the course the student is able to:

- 1) demonstrate physical competence in a variety of movement and dance practices, principles, and styles
- 2) articulate the relation between the variety of dance practices presented in the course and their own individual interests and practice and
- 3) account for methods of writing and discussing presented in the course.
