Study period: 1 September - 9 November 2025

Total of ECTS: 18

Music dramatic performance 3 – language, expression, communication, 22.5 credits (modules corresponding to 18 ECTS from the course):

- Song, 4 ECTS
- Musical performance with lyrical diction in foreign languages, 6.5 ECTS
- Music dramatic performance, 9 ECTS

Learning outcomes

On completion of the 18 ECTS from the course, the student should:

- be able to use the timbre of the voice to communicate musical and textual content in a foreign language,
- be able to use their voice in such a way that it carries, in both piano and forte, in a large room with an orchestra,
- evaluate their own vocal strengths and weaknesses and on this basis define their need for further knowledge and development,
- be able to recognise at a basic level the importance of language and text in musical performance in foreign languages,
- be able to perform musically in concert form with conductor and orchestra,
- be able to define repertoire relevant to their own level of vocal development,
- be able to perform an opera role in a foreign language in scenes or arias,
- be able to problematise the relationship between language and performance,
- be able to build a character in a foreign language independently and in co-operation with others,
- demonstrate physical awareness and ability in performance,
- be able to apply methods for dealing with external and internal stress in connection with their professional practice,
- demonstrate knowledge of and critically reflect on the labour market and the professional life for which the student is being trained.

- be able to perform music dramatically in the form of a concert.

On completion of the course, the student should:

- at a basic level, be able to handle the interaction between musical theatre performance, instrumental ensemble, conductor and vocal technique
- be able to perform a longer piece of material in a performance in co-operation with the director, conductor and instrumental ensemble,
- be able to perform musically in a physically realised stage concert,
- be able to perform music drama in co-operation with a director, conductor and instrumental ensemble,
- be able to perform music drama in a physically realised stage concert,

- be able to reflect on their own artistic approach in co-operation with other professional groups in opera,
- be able to perform physical theatre at an advanced level,
- be able to independently use and further develop skills in melody, harmony and rhythm,
- independently analyse and present an advanced score.
