Entry Requirements

General Entry Requirements:

for studies at the first cycle with the exception of Swedish 1-3 and English 6.

Specific Entry Requirements:

30 credits within the artistic field.

Selection

If there are more qualified applicants than places a selection will be made. The selection will be based on an assessment of merits uploaded with the application.

The assessment considers prior education and experience of working with artistic practices with a focus on, and connection to, the course content.

Selection among applicants who apply for the course as an elective course within a programme at Stockholm University of the Arts is done by lottery.

Language of Instruction

The main language of instruction is English.

Course Content

The course provides an overview to Sara Ahmed's phenomenological theories on whiteness and heterosexuality, which can be used as points of orientation in artistic strategies within performing arts. The student is given opportunity to relate these strategies and methods to their own practical work, with the aim to formulate queer and decolonizing points of orientation in artistic methods and expressions. The course is based on the theories and analyzes of Sara Ahmed, illustrated by artistic examples and presentations of the course participants' own practices.

Teaching Forms

Lectures, workshops, group work

Intended Learning Outcomes

After completing the course the student:

- 1) is able to problematize and critically reflect on how whiteness and heterosexuality relates to hegemonic understandings of artistic quality,
- 2) is able to problematize and discuss how Sara Ahmed's theories of points of orientation can be implemented in their own artistic practice
- 3) is able to apply theories and strategies raised in the course in their own practical work.

Examination

(1001) Oral, written and practical assignment, 7.5 credits, regarding learning outcomes 1-3, grades Fail (U) or Pass (G).
