Language of Instruction

The main language of instruction is English.

Course Content

In this course, students encounter different creative methods and materials from art, philosophy, religion and technology that in different ways relate to the imagining of the body. The course explores forms of contemplation, encounter and artistic meaning-making at the intersection of text, the human body and technological interfaces constituted by language, objects and digital medias. From a critical angle, students will explore what it means to be a body and creating works of art in times of technological, ecological and social entanglement.

This exploration will be carried out through guided workshops, film screenings and reading seminars. The purpose of the workshops is to share hands-on methodology and the seminars are there to create a common theoretical ground. In the later part of the course the students will

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develop and share an artistic proposal that involves embodied imagination. These proposals will be discussed with the support from the concepts and methodologies introduced in the course.

Teaching Forms

Writing sessions, praxis sessions, workshops, movie screenings, guest lectures and reading groups.

Intended Learning Outcomes

After completing the course the student is able to:

- 1) understand and critically reflect on the relationshio between the concepts of imagination, embodiment and interface in relation to the course content
- 2) develop and present an artistic proposal including their own understanding of what the imagining body can be.

Examination
