General Entry Requirements:

Specific Entry Requirements:

Artistic Development within the Circus Discipline I, 30 credits, alternatively Artistic Development within the Circus Discipline 1, 20 credits.

Artistic Development within the Circus Discipline II, 30 credits, alternatively Artistic Development within the Circus Discipline 2, 20 credits.

At least 120 credits within the main field of study Circus or the equivalent.

Selection

If there are more eligible applicants than places, a selection is done. The selection is based on the merits of the applicants. In the assessment, special consideration is given to experience/activities with a focus on and connection to the course content.

Language of Instruction

The main language of instruction is English.

Course Content

The course aims for the student to deepen their ability to independently carry out artistic development work within their discipline and to critically review their own and other students' artistic processes. The course includes the presentation of artistic development work within the circus discipline under technical and artistic supervision. The course includes discussions and seminars around vision, method and artistic processes as well as reports based on idea, process and results. The student writes a process diary.

The Course consists of the following modules:

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Theme, Aim and Method, 15 credits

In the module, the student, together with the supervisor and the group, develops a theme, purpose and method in their artistic development work.

Implementation and Presentation, 15 credits

In the module, the student carries out their artistic development work independently.

Teaching Forms

Lectures, seminars, workshops, individual coaching, individual tutoring, group tutoring, teacher-led teaching.

Intended Learning Outcomes

Theme, Aim and Method, 15 credits After completing the course the student is able to:

- 1) independently develop aim and theme for a more complex artistic idea within current circus discipline,
- 2) critically review and discuss the relevance of different methods to implement their artistic idea,
- 3) discuss and place their idea based on a contemporary circus context,
- 4) discuss and analyze own and others' artistic processes,
- 5) make thoughtful choices regarding methods, work process and planning,
- 6) choose practical tools for their artistic idea and then be able to question and modify them during the process,

Implementation and Presentation, 15 credits

After completing the course the student is able to:

- 7) prepare and practically implement an independent own artistic development work,
- 8) develop and work continuously with a documentation that in writing, and other appropriate forms, reflects on one's own artistic process,
- 9) physically and verbally be able to present an artistic development work based on method, process and results,
- 10) be able to critically examine and value one's own and others' artistic works.

Implementation and Presentation, 15 credits

(1002) Practical presentation and selected parts of the process diary, 15 credits, regarding learning outcomes 7-10. Grades: Fail (U) Pass (G).
