Entry Requirements

General Entry Requirements:

for studies at the first cycle with the exception of Swedish 1-3 and English 6.

120 credits in artistic subjects or the equivalent

Selection

Selection for the course is based upon an overall assessment of the applicant's submitted application and documents. The assessment takes into consideration prior education, work experience or other experiences relevant for the course. Particular consideration is given to prior experiences of the fields of dance, choreography and visual art.

Selection among applicants who are to study the course as an elective course in program studies at Stockholm University of the Arts takes place by lottery.

Language of Instruction

The main language of instruction is English.

Course Content

The course illuminates the notion of expanded choreography as a cross-media and discipline overlapping methodology for widening the artistic agency of performing and visual artists. Participants explore collaborative artistic practices and investigate concepts, approaches, and methods for encounters with visitors and audiences in theaters, galleries, museums, and other venues.
