Entry Requirements

General Entry Requirements:

for studies at the first cycle with the exception of Swedish 1-3 and English 6.

Specific Entry Requirements:

7.5 credits in dance or equivalent experience of scenic and / or pedagogical artistic work with the body as a tool.

Selection

In the assessment, special consideration is given to experience of working with the body as a tool.

Language of Instruction

The main language of instruction is English.

Course Content

In the course, the student develops basic knowledge in Klein Technique™, as well as basic knowledge in Klein Technique™ as a method for process in relation to one's own practice. The course includes practice, physical learning in Klein Technique™, reading of texts, conversations, group discussions, individual work and written reflections.

Teaching Forms

Teacher led workshops and assignments, and individual work.

Intended Learning Outcomes

After completing the course the student is able to:

- 1. have the ability to reflect and discuss the basic principles of Klein Technique™ and their individual development process,
- 2. have the ability to reflect on Klein Technique™ as a method of process and
- 3. evaluate Klein Technique's™ possibilities in relation to one's own practice.

Examination

(1001) The course is examined through oral and written assignment, 7.5 credits regarding Intended Learning Outcomes 1, 2 and 3.

If a student fails an ordinary examination, the student has the right to undergo additional examination opportunities to obtain a passing result.

If a student has a decision from Stockholm University of the Arts about special pedagogical support due to functional variance, the examiner can decide on alternative forms of examination in consultation with the student.
